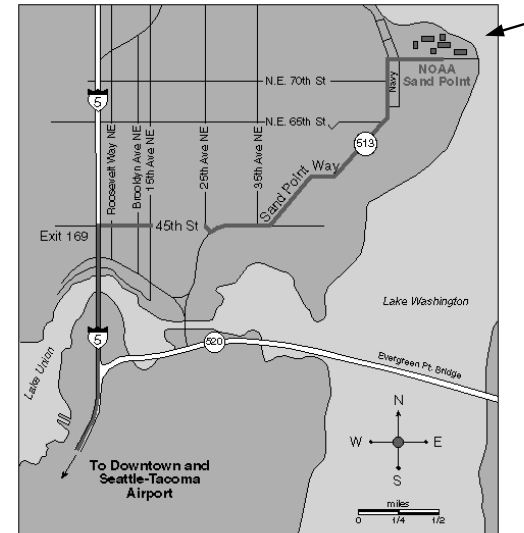

Conference Location and Driving Instructions



From I-5, north or southbound:

Take exit 169, NE 45th St, eastbound. At the bottom of the hill (Univ. Viaduct) turn left and continue E on NE 45th St. (SR513). NE 45th turns into Sandpoint Way. Continue NE on Sand Point Way about 7 miles to NE 70th St, and the former Sand Point Naval Air Station. At the north end of the former base (76th) turn right into the NOAA Station and stop at the guard gate. Follow the main road and park in the lots for Buildings 1,2,9. The meeting is in the NOAA Auditorium., Building 9

From SR 520 (Evergreen Point Bridge), westbound:

Take Montlake exit on to Montlake Blvd, (SR513) going north. Continue on Montlake past University Husky Stadium to NE 45th. Follow NE 45th NE until it becomes Sand Point Way. Continue NE on Sand Point Way about 7 miles to NE 70th St, and the former Sand Point Naval Air Station. At the north end of the former base (76th) turn right into the NOAA Station and stop at the guard gate. The meeting is in the NOAA Auditorium. Follow the main road and park in the lots for Buildings 1,2,9. The meeting is in the NOAA Auditorium., Building 9.

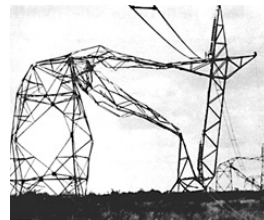
